when young spit macphee comes to live with his grandfather the people of the australian country town of st helen fear for his future fyfe macphee is a crazy old man and barefoot spit has to fend for himself along the riverbank where they live while some people feel that spit can look after himself others believe he would be better cared for in a boys home and when old fyfe dies after one of his turns a fierce

battle to decide spit s destiny begins featuring a new introduction from phillip gwynne in this text classics edition the true story of spit macphee is a much loved quintessentially australian novel for readers of all ages james aldridge is a multi award winning australian author and journalist aldridge was born in bendigo and his family moved to swan hill in the mid 1920s his novels based on the real living conditions of swan hill include his 1985 children s book council of australia book of the year the true story of lilli stubeck and the guardian children s fiction prize winning the true story of spit macphee james aldridge now lives in london

max lily boaz and jesse are stuck in kids club at an island resort forced to watch endless pirates of the caribbean re runs while their parents relax by the pool after eight days they decide to break out and let the real fun begin

when little owl falls from his nest and opens his eyes for the very first time he has one big question whooooo whoooo whoooo am i little owl nibbles on a blossom with a hungry sugar glider hangs upside down with the bats in the branches and struts on the ground like the cranky cockatoo but at the end of the day little owl still isn t sure who he is until from out of the darkness comes a distant whoooo whoooo whoooo this simple repetitive text by phillip gwynne accompanied by the sumptuous illustrations of sandy okalyi will be a favourite for early readers

milly loves the small town she lives in and she loves playing basketball with her friends the trouble is families keep leaving and soon they won t have enough players for a team but when milly learns at school about the refugees who have nowhere to live she has a great idea invite them to gong gong

when her husband of three decades announces he has a younger lover and wants a divorce ella ferguson realises how protected her life has been she has seen no evil heard no evil and spoken no evil alone enraged she must come to terms with her failed marriage and her

relationships with her adult children a change in the lighting amy witting s third novel is the compelling story of a woman cast adrift amy witting was born in annandale an inner suburb of sydney in 1918 she attended sydney university then taught french and english in state schools beginning late in life she published six novels including the visit i for isobel isobel on the way to the corner shop and maria s war two collections of short stories two books of verse travel diary and beauty is the straw and her collected poems she had numerous poems and short stories published in magazines such as quadrant and the new yorker witting was awarded the 1993 patrick white prize isobel on the way to the corner shop won the age book of the year award amy witting died in 2001 a wry and powerful novel of family entanglements sydney morning herald

the first volume of autobiography by celebrated writer ruth park author of the harp in the south and winner of the miles franklin award the age book of the year and the colin roderick award

on the surface chopville appears not unlike any other small town in rural australia however its underbelly is more than extraordinary amongst its modest community reside six people from two very different families they make up the six most powerful people in the world today branded as sorcerers they are the only six people in the world with true magical power yet these two families do not cooperate together and although there is no open fighting in the year 2010 things weren't always that peaceful john playman knows this as well as anyone at the age of 14 he is familiar with the concept of magic having been raised in a family heavily involved in the magical war 30 years earlier even though he has never met any of the sorcerers himself this year however all that is about to change john and a group of his school friends will find themselves in an unprecedented situation and carrying a responsibility almost too great to comprehend john and his cohorts struggle on two fronts with their hormones raging and with the discovery of whom among them is to become the seventh sorcerer

his eyes are on the one eye of the rifle his mouth splits open his brown beard he throws up a hand palm outward in an unwilling futile gesture to ward off death a killer is hounding the seaside town of old tornwich residents are gripped by fear and suspicion and the finger of

blame is pointed in all directions but the bodies keep falling and the crimes remain unsolved the culprit at large no mere whodunnit the suburbs of hell its story inspired by a real life serial killer is a profoundly disturbing psychological drama with a devastating conclusion the final work of one of australia s greatest writers julian randolph mick stow was born in geraldton western australia in 1935 he attended local schools before boarding at guildford grammar in perth where the renowned author kenneth mackenzie had been a student while at university he sent his poems to a british publisher the resulting collection act one won the australian literature society s gold medal in 1957 as did the prolific young writer s third novel to the islands the following year to the islands also won the 1958 miles franklin literary award stow reworked the novel for a second edition almost twenty five years later but never allowed its two predecessors to be republished he worked briefly as an anthropologist s assistant in new guinea an experience that subsequently informed visitants one of three masterful late novels then fell seriously ill and returned to australia in the 1960s he lectured at universities in australia and england and lived in america on a harkness fellowship he published his second collection of verse outrider the novel tourmaline on which critical opinion was divided and his most popular fiction the merry go round in the sea and midnite for years afterwards stow produced mainly poetry libretti and reviews in 1969 he settled permanently in england first in suffolk then in essex where he moved in 1981 he received the 1979 patrick white award randolph stow died in 2010 aged seventy four a private man a prodigiously gifted yet intermittently silent author he has been hailed as the least visible figure of that great twentieth century triumvirate of australian novelists whose other members are patrick white and christina stead praise for the suburbs of hell both a traditional murder mystery and a meditation on the random depredations of death australian book review poetic accuracy is only one aspect of a rich talent mr stow has a narrative gift as well he is in fact a real novelist observer a cleverly crafted whodunit stow is an example of the high calibre of australian writers of yesterday many of these authors have been forgotten or perhaps overlooked it s pleasing to see that text publishing released this edition in 2015 and continue to foster some of australia s buried talents by re publishing under text classics for fans of the psychological thriller and those readers who enjoy a foray into a metaphorical tale stow delivers the goods salty popcorn

of the patrick white award that year christina stead died in sydney in 1983 aged eighty she is widely considered to be one of the most influential australian authors of the twentieth century stead is of that category of fiction writer who restores to us the entire world in its infinite complexity and inexorable bitterness and never asks if the reader wishes to be so furiously enlightened and instructed but takes it for granted that this is the function of fiction angela carter london review of books it s not easy to explain how much pleasure there was in reading christina stead s second novel the beauties and furies it is such a dynamic novel rich with wonderfully complex characters and a compelling storyline the beauties and furies is a brilliant novel anz lit lovers stead paints an enticing kinetic picture of parisian café life and rented lodgings friendly prostitutes and dissipated journalists a sort of update of a moveable feast spiced with the rising threat of fascism she also shows the influence as the helpful introduction notes of joyce s ulysses with a resourceful lexicon of wordplay stream of consciousness and bravura passages that stand out from her conventional prose the way marpurgo s evil overshadows the small sins of adultery a welcome reissue of an intriguing atmospherically rich work kirkus reviews starred review

written with unerring skill and insight the dyehouse is a masterly portrait of postwar australia when industrial work was radically transformed by new technologies and society changed with it mena calthorpe who herself worked in a textile factory takes us inside this world vividly bringing to life the people of an inner sydney company in the mid 1950s the bosses middlemen and underlings their dramatic struggles and their loves this powerful and affecting novel was first published in 1961 and is the hundredth book in the text classics series the new edition comes with an introduction by fiona mcfarlane acclaimed author of the night guest mena calthorpe was born in goulburn new south wales in 1905 and grew up there after marrying calthorpe moved to sydney and lived for most of her life in the sutherland shire working in office jobs and writing in her spare time she was active in literary groups and in the labor party for some years she was a member of the communist party and she opposed b a santamaria s attempts to stop communism in trade unions the dyehouse 1961 was followed by the defectors 1969 which dramatised unions internal power struggles mena calthorpe s third and final novel was the plain of ala an irish migrant story which was published in 1989 she died in 1996 the dyehouse is executed with a singular combination of charm grace and tough mindedness meanjin the dyehouse is an extraordinary book a true ensemble novel written with astonishing control and animated by compassionate intelligence with its indelible sydney setting it deserves more than deserves to take its place among the great australian novels about work and to be celebrated as the 100th text classic fiona mcfarlane a reminder of how rarely these days fiction tackles the world of work that so dominates our lives worth reading as much for its social history and its understanding of human nature as its rendering of the labour capital clash australian vivid fresh and utterly unsentimental re reading the dyehouse now i am struck by how technically accomplished it is and how each of its many characters is made distinct and alive with extraordinary economy calthorpe s own experience of factory and office work provides the dyehouse with many authentic touches including much detail about the dyeing process but that is not what generates this novel s compelling power what is so remarkable is how it captures and presents a microcosmic world in

i love you more than god loves the world little published in her lifetime lesbia harford died young in the late 1920s her short lyrical poems about social justice revolution free love feminism and the experience of women display a candour and dynamism unusual for her time and place this essential new selection of her finest work chosen and introduced by gerald murnane reaffirms harford s position as one of australia s pre eminent modern poets lesbia harford was born in 1891 she published few poems in her lifetime her work gathered in posthumous collections and various anthologies has since been acclaimed for its clear and unadorned style a congenital heart defect kept her in poor health her whole life and she died in 1927 at the age of thirty six gerald murnane was born in melbourne in 1939 he has been a primary teacher an editor and a university lecturer his debut novel tamarisk row 1974 was followed by ten other works of fiction including the plains and most recently border districts in 1999 murnane won the patrick white award and in 2009 he won the melbourne prize for literature he lives in western victoria lesbia harford s poetry is astonishing drusilla modjeska

i told them to go into the scrub and disperse the tribe disperse that is a strange word what do you mean by dispersing firing at them two decades after a massacre of local aboriginal people the former residents of a queensland town have reunited to celebrate the progress and prosperity of their community tom dorahy returning to his hometown is having none of it he wants those responsible to own up to their actions a reckoning with oppression guilt and the weight of the past a kindness cup is one of thea astley s greatest achievements thea astley was born in brisbane in 1925 her first novel girl with a monkey was published in 1958 and her third the well dressed explorer 1962 won the miles franklin literary award many notable books followed among them the groundbreaking a kindness cup 1974 which addressed frontier massacres of indigenous australians and it s raining in mango 1987 her last novel was drylands 1999 her fourth miles franklin winner her fiction is distinguished by vivid imagery and metaphor a complex ironic style and a desire to highlight oppression and social injustice one of the most distinctive and influential australian novelists of the twentieth century astley died in 2004 smart compassionate new york times one of the earliest and most empathetic postwar engagements by a white australian writer with the horrors of nineteenth century racial violence australian book review this timely and attractively priced reissue is a welcome chance to reconsider astley s rich oeuvre astley s

work is characterised by her irony and unflinching scrutiny of social injustice in a kindness cup she was at the top of her impressive form this short novel is one of australia s finest stuff nz
